Representative Sampling of Community Donations

Major Air Products Lake Maurepas Community Fund donations include:

- \$400,000 to the Manchac Volunteer Fire Department for first responder boats
- \$400,000 to the Springfield Volunteer Fire Department for a first responder boat and \$200,000 for two years of night shift coverage
- \$250,000 to the Wildlife and Fisheries
 Foundation for fish stocking in Lake Maurepas
- \$100,000 to the Livingston Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness for new emergency operations center communications equipment
- \$100,000 to Livingston Parish to supply tankers of water to the Town of Killian during its water emergency

- Non-profit organizations that support ecological, safety, educational, and recreational improvements in the Lake Maurepas area are eligible for grants.
- Local community leaders with a deep understanding of Lake Maurepas make up the Fund's advisory board, along with key Air Products employees who live and work in the area.
- The Fund further deepens Air Products' commitment to being a good neighbor in Louisiana and all areas where it operates.
